

UPDATE ON SHARED PASTOR MEETINGS

On Wednesday, June 11th, Gary, Bev and Peg met with 3 pastoral search committee members from United Church of Faith in Keota. The meeting was led by Pastor Erin Kaye as representative for the Presbyterian Church and Deacon Jodi Schuman, assistant to the Bishop from our Synod office.

We reviewed numbers that had been brought to our last meeting by both churches reflecting what we each felt we could budget towards a shared pastor salary. Jodi Schuman will enter items reviewed and discussed and will draft a covenant between our 2 churches that we will then review at our next combined meeting.

We are looking at a 60/40 time split for a full-time pastor to be shared between our 2 churches, which reflects the amount each congregation feels they can bring to the table. The estimate is \$58,000 from Immanuel and \$15,000 from Keota, along with the use of the parsonage they currently own (which is considered a \$30,000 value). With the use of a parsonage, we don't have to provide a housing allowance as part of the pastor's salary. So we are looking at a 60% pastor for us at Immanuel.

We will be discussing this at our Immanuel Lutheran council meeting after church next week for their input.

One line item in this covenant will be listing worship times at each church. We have tentatively agreed that 8:30 and 10:30 will be the 2 suggested service times. It is yet to be determined which church would be at which time. Currently, both churches have 9 am Sunday services. Please give this a lot of thought in the coming weeks as we move forward. At our next combined meeting we will review this covenant. If the search committees of both churches agree, we will then bring this before each of our councils. If approved by the councils then it will be brought individually to each congregation for vote. If approved, a combined call committee will be formed with members from each congregation.



The VBS kids have once again planted a Sharing Garden outside the church. There are 5 raised beds with onions, lettuce, carrots, snap peas, green beans, cabbage, sweet corn, tomatoes, peppers, zucchini, pumpkins, and watermelon. As you see these things becoming

The financial committee would like to share the finalized numbers for the month of March. These numbers are in summary of our income and expenses:

April brought us another small positive balance in our finances. We are on the right track of getting our YTD total into a positive #. I feel like a broken record each month with our main difference being our pastor expenses.

The phase "April Showers bring May flowers" is one of my favorite quotes. Spring is probably my favorite time of year to watch the earth come to life for another season. The curiosity of what survived the cold winter brings me excitement. Planting the new seeds, anxiously waiting for them to sprout, takes a lot of my patience's. The excitement in seeing the new growth and then the blooms brings me so much joy. With this time of year it also reminds me of the new beginnings, growth and blessings in everyday living.


I feel that our church is going through the same emotions at the moment in trying to find a pastor. There is a lot of curiosity, anxiousness, and excitement. Gary announced that we were looking to offer a salary around \$55,000 towards a pastor. If you break this down for the year it comes out to \$4,583 per month. (This is what we are currently paying Pastor Cindy.) If you have followed monthly you know that monthly #'s run tight since we have been paying a Pastor. BUT tight does not mean undoable. From a financial stand point looking at a salary around this amount would be a good choice for our congregation. There are several outstanding questions at this time (ex: benefit package including retirement and health insurance). These questions and answers could possible throw up some red flags with our current financial #'s. Please reach out to council members or myself if you have any questions.

"April showers of blessings" serves as a reminder that life's challenges can lead to beautiful outcomes. Embracing this concept encourages us to remain hopeful and faithful, trusting that after every storm, there are blessings waiting to bloom in our lives.
