

-Noisy offering to support the confirmation projects, more information on projects in the hallway and how you can help. Confirmation Sunday is April 26th, cake reception to follow church.


-Senior Sunday on Sunday, May 3rd with reception to follow church.

January Summary:

In January, total income was \$10,017.83, while total expenses were \$11,593.88, resulting in a net operating loss of \$1,576.05. Although expenses exceeded income for the month, the church continued faithfully supporting pastoral leadership, staff, ministries, and facilities. Even in a tighter month, God's provision sustained ongoing ministry and mission.

Overall (Year-to-Date) Summary:

Year-to-date income totals \$48,546.00, while total year-to-date expenses are \$50,532.91, resulting in a net operating loss of \$1,986.91. When comparing January 2026 to January 2025, our net loss improved by \$1,586.48, cutting last year's deficit nearly in half. Although January 2026 closed with a loss, the church demonstrated meaningful financial improvement over the previous year. Expenses were carefully managed, and primary giving increased. This reduced deficit reflects both wise stewardship and the continued faithfulness and generosity of our congregation. We remain grateful for God's provision and confident that He will continue to guide and sustain the ministry in the months ahead.

We are grateful for the generosity of the congregation and supporters. The Lord continues to provide through faithful giving, allowing the church to meet its obligations and carry out its calling. Even in months of challenge, we trust in God's steady provision and remain committed to wise stewardship of the resources He has entrusted to us.


